What is Invisalign?

Invisalign Treatment is the **clear alternative to traditional braces** when it comes to straightening teeth

Invisalign braces treatment is an orthodontic clear aligner system designed to facilitate the adjustment of teeth for optimal dental occlusion (straighter teeth, better bite, better smile). This treatment involves the use of a series of FDA-approved plastic clear aligners.

The Invisalign system has been designed to be an alternative to conventional braces, allowing patients to achieve the smile that they've always wanted without the conventional metal brackets.

When worn, these plastic clear aligners are virtually invisible, on top of this, these aligners are easily detachable for daily activities, including drinking, brushing, eating, and special activities.

These aligners have no bands or metal wires that irritate the mouth, patients can wear them conveniently and comfortably. Each clear aligner is fully customised to the patient and they fit comfortably over teeth. The aligners are designed in a series and gradually shift teeth into a pre-planned position over time with the change of each aligner. There is a common misconception that Invisalign clear aligner treatment is only suitable for patients with mild orthodontic issues.

The truth is that Invisalign treatment is able to correct a wide variety of malocclusion problems.

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Invisalign has the ability to effectively address these common occlusal issues; Spacing, Open Bites, Cross Bites, Over-Jet, Under-Bite, Deep Bite and Crooked Teeth.

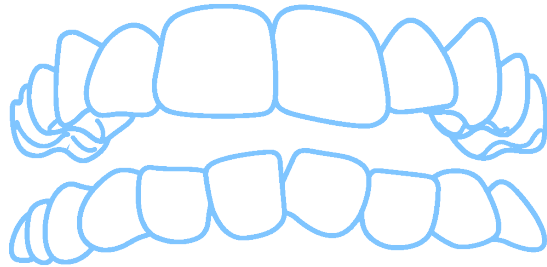

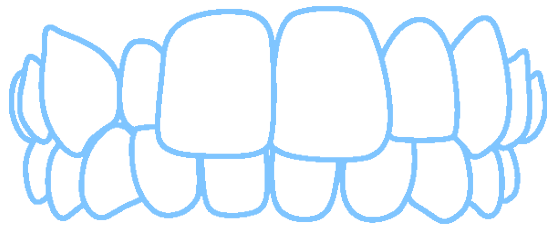
Crowding

Crowding is when you don't have enough room in your jaw for your teeth to fit normally. Your teeth can bunch up, overlap and twist, sometimes getting pushed to the front or the back.



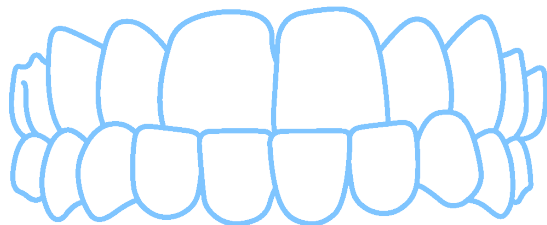
Cross Bite

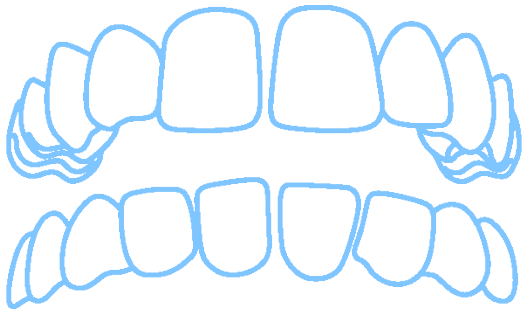
Cross bite is the orthodontic condition where patients have some of their upper teeth sit behind their lower teeth when the mouth is closed. – Rather than on the outside like they normally would. This condition may lead to abnormal wearing of teeth and even chipping.



Under Bite

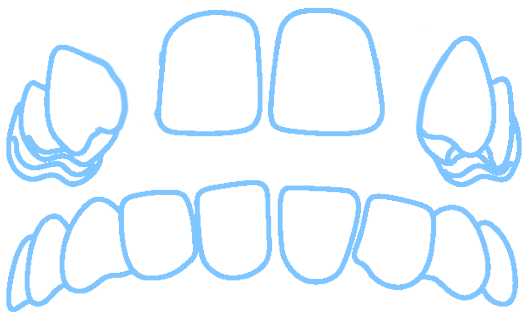
An under bite is a condition when your lower teeth and jaw protrude in front of the upper teeth. Severe cases may cause difficulty biting or chewing food or challenges when speaking.





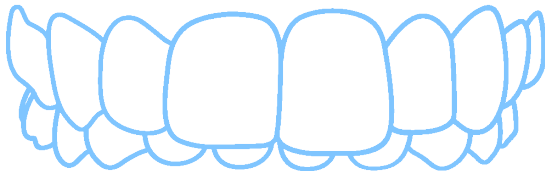
Spacing

Spacing is when you have extra space between two or more of your teeth. It may not look nice and can cause food to be trapped easily during eating, which may result in tooth decay and gum problems.



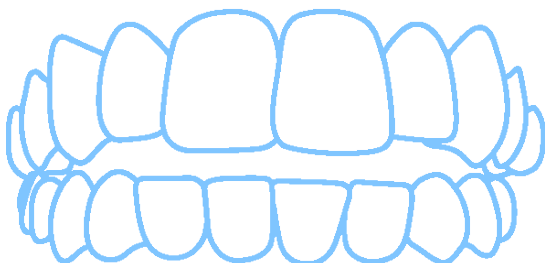
Missing Teeth

Certain types of spacing caused from missing teeth can be closed through the use of Invisalign treatment. These spaces may appear unattractive and if the spaces are large, they can cause speech problems.



Over Bite

An excessive overbite is when your upper front teeth cover too much of your lower front teeth. The lower front teeth may cause trauma to your upper gums.



Open Bite

An open bite is when your upper and lower teeth don't touch when your mouth is closed. An open bite may affect your appearance and may cause speech problems like having a lisp.

Invisalign Cost in Singapore?

Here's what you need to know about Invisalign pricing

In Singapore, Invisalign treatment costs range from about \$4500 - \$8000 when performed by a general dentist. The cost of Invisalign lies between \$7000 - \$9500 for treatment by an orthodontist (braces specialist). Some dental clinics are able to quote lower prices (i.e. in the \$3500 to \$6000 range) because they do not include pre-treatment, mid-treatment and aftercare expenses, for example: Dental X-Rays, Treatment Plan and Retainers.



Most importantly: If you were quoted a lower price, do ask your dentist if it includes refinement costs to achieve a better treatment result. This may involve changing of attachments and a re-scan or re-impression, followed by a new series of aligners at the end of your original course of treatment. Ultimately, the actual cost of your Invisalign treatment will depend primarily on your individual case needs.

Simpler cases require fewer aligners, while more complex cases require more aligners, so it may be helpful to get a personalised cost estimate from a few different dentists. In general, Invisalign treatment that takes 1 year will be far less costly than treatment that takes 2 or more years.

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Invisalign costs range from about \$7000 - \$9500 in total for treatment by an orthodontist
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How much does the Invisalign consultation cost?

Most Invisalign consultations cost \$50-\$100 on average. This excludes the records that may be taken on the consultation visit should you choose to go ahead with Invisalign treatment plan. Some clinics do absorb the consultation fees if you decide to proceed with Invisalign Treatment.

Do remember to ask the front staff on the phone about the consultation fees before you make an appointment.



What accounts for the difference in Invisalign pricing?

The price of Invisalign is highly dependant upon the complexity of the movements required during treatment.

The complexity correlates with the number of aligners required for treatment and the duration of treatment.

Invisalign treatment options are broadly divided into 4 categories:

- **Comprehensive**
- **Moderate**
- **Lite**
- **Express**

These categories demarcate the number of aligners manufactured for you, and by extension, the laboratory fees that your dentist has to pay to Invisalign. **More details can be seen in the table below.**

As explained, the main differences in cost are due to complexity and your case requirements.

If your case requires a lot of tooth movement (ie. more aligners), or tooth extractions to create space to correct crowding or protrusion, this will usually result in a longer treatment time and require a comprehensive treatment option.

On the other hand, you may be suitable for an Invisalign Lite treatment if you only have minor crowding (Eg. if you had previous braces treatment but your teeth have relapsed).

You should definitely consult a dentist to see which treatment package is more suitable for you.

Express, Lite, Moderate or Comprehensive Treatment?

As a general rule-of-thumb, each Invisalign aligner is able to achieve about 0.25mm of tooth movement. Your dentist/orthodontist will determine which treatment option is best suited to you based on the amount of tooth movement required. However, virtual planning/simulations and actual outcomes are two different things altogether. What happens on the computer screen can be quite different from what happens in a patient's mouth.

The virtual treatment plan is a prediction of how your teeth will move, and sometimes teeth may move slightly differently from the plan. When this happens, more aligners may be needed to achieve the desired result.

Consequently, most dentists prefer to choose a treatment option that allows for a reasonable degree of error, rather than having to get their patients to pay more for additional aligners down the road.



The treatment package required depends on the complexity of your case.





Subsidies or discounts for Invisalign treatment?

Unfortunately, you can't make use of Medisave to pay for Invisalign treatment as it's not considered a surgical procedure.

This is a common question that our dentists get all the time. **Unfortunately, there are also NO subsidies from the Ministry of Health for braces treatment or Invisalign treatment** in government hospitals, tertiary institutions or in private clinics in Singapore.

The main rationale for this is that Invisalign treatment is considered to be “elective”, meaning that treatment is ‘not strictly necessary for basic dental health’ and not doing the treatment would not affect basic functions. It will be hard to justify using tax-payers’ money for a procedure that doesn’t require immediate attention as compared to, for example, a surgical extraction for wisdom teeth.

Hence if you choose to do Invisalign for aesthetic reasons, you will have to pay for the treatment yourself.

What about dental insurance for Invisalign?

Dental coverage for braces is usually an additional benefit that does not come as standard on most health insurance plans.

Furthermore, Invisalign treatment is considered an aesthetic orthodontic treatment and is usually not covered even with a dental cover in your insurance plan.





Will Invisalign treatment be shorter and cheaper if I have previously had braces/aligner treatment but my teeth moved back?

Relapse cases are patients who previously underwent braces/aligner treatment but their teeth have moved after completing Invisalign treatment as they did not wear retainers.

The price of relapse cases will depend on the complexity/severity of the relapse and the final desired outcome that you have.

Typically, these “relapse cases” are not too complex and your Invisalign treatment should not take as long as your original braces/clear aligner treatment. However, patients should understand that the amount of treatment time required for relapse cases, as well as the associated costs, will depend on:

- The amount of relapse that has occurred (The distance that the teeth have been shifted).
- The type of tooth movement and time required to move teeth to an ideal position.

Do note that treatment time may be shorter (eg. 8 to 10 months instead of 18 to 24 months), but costs may not be cheaper if it still falls under an Invisalign Moderate or Comprehensive case.

To better understand your current dental condition, you can explain your case directly to a dentist, who will then be able to advise you on treatment time and costs.

If the shifting of your teeth is mild, then of course you will have other options to realign your teeth, such as Invisalign Express, Invisalign Lite, and in-house aligners.



How fast does Invisalign work?

The average Invisalign treatment course takes about a year, but most of the patients start seeing some improvements after wearing their aligners for 2 – 3 months. For the best results, patients are advised to wear their aligners for 20 - 22 hours a day.

Traditionally, patients are typically instructed to change their aligners once every two weeks, which means that most patients would have a total treatment time of 1-2 years, depending on the number of sets of aligners they were issued.

However, given the rise of newer clear aligner technologies in Invisalign, patients can change their aligners on a weekly or 10 day basis. This has helped to significantly reduce the overall treatment time.

Whether you are eligible for a more frequent change of aligner depends on factors such as:

- How well you wear your aligners
- How difficult your tooth movements are
- Whether you require extractions
- Your age - teeth generally move faster in younger patients as compared to older patients, due to higher cell activity and lower bone density

In general, the patients would start with changes every two weeks, with some being able to reduce the number of days between changes according to their progress and amount of wear.

Do the results of Invisalign treatment last forever?

Yes, results from Invisalign treatment do last forever, but only if patients wear their retainers regularly. This applies to ALL types of orthodontic treatments, including traditional braces. The purpose of retainers is to hold the teeth in their new position. Without retainers, teeth WILL shift, and patients will lose the great results which they had worked so hard to achieve.

To us, patients' compliance with retainer wear after Invisalign treatment is more important than the Invisalign treatment itself. Our dentists see so many patients coming in for orthodontic treatment a second or third time, simply due to a lack of retainer wear.

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The final results from Invisalign Treatment are permanent. These results can last forever as long as patients use retainers to hold their teeth in this final position.



The total treatment time for Invisalign and traditional braces is the same

Overall, the treatment time between the two is not very different, despite what most people believed about Invisalign taking longer.

Our dentists always mentally prepare their Invisalign patients that they may not see their teeth straightening out so quickly at the beginning. This is because teeth alignment are always planned in stages, for example, sometimes space need to be created at the back to allow the crowded front teeth to be pushed into alignment.

The staging of teeth movements also applies to conventional braces. However, with conventional braces the wires are always applying forces to move the teeth, hence ensuring a more certain result, whereas the effects of Invisalign is very dependent on whether the patient is wearing their aligners for enough hours every day. If used according to dentist instructions, you will definitely see results in time. **If you've had friends who told you that their Invisalign treatment took much longer, it is likely because they were not very obedient with following their dentist's instructions!**

What our dentists have found in their patients is that after the novelty of Invisalign wears off, people tend to get lazier with their aligner wear, which causes their teeth not to move as well as before, in turn resulting in the need for additional aligners and treatment time.



What are the advantages of Invisalign over traditional braces?

This is a comparison between the two treatment options.

Are the benefits of Invisalign over braces purely cosmetic?

Although aesthetics is Invisalign's biggest selling point, easy maintenance of oral hygiene, and the ability to eat whatever you want are close contenders. Many of us live to eat, and wearing fixed braces makes it difficult to enjoy eating all your favourite foods.

This is because with traditional braces:

- You will need to cut your food into smaller pieces at times.
- Avoiding hard and sticky foods is strongly advised to avoid breakages - we've had many patients come in for unscheduled appointments due to breakages of their braces from unexpectedly biting onto a popcorn kernel that was hiding in their popcorn during a movie!
- Maintaining oral hygiene is difficult, especially for those who are prone to tooth decay or have trouble maintaining good oral hygiene. You will need to clean very well around the brackets and the wires to prevent further tooth decay or gum disease.

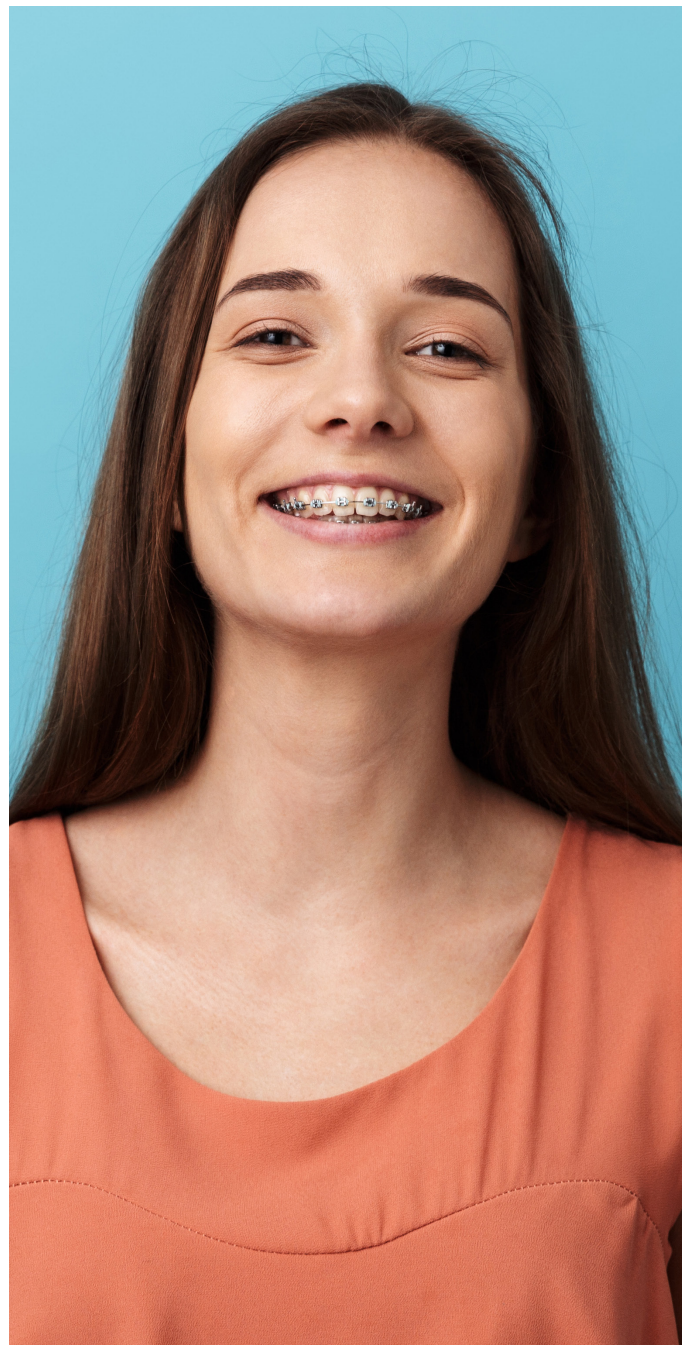
Additionally, wearing Invisalign aligners at night also provides protection against grinding, and some of my patients with jaw joint pain do report improvement. You should consult an orthodontist if you want to find out more. The most effective treatment for you really depend on your condition.



Are there any other aesthetic options for braces besides Invisalign?

Some orthodontists also offer lingual braces (braces on the inside of the teeth). An example would be the Incognito system, which is possibly even more “aesthetic” and invisible than Invisalign.

However, the cost of lingual braces is even higher than Invisalign. It can also cause more discomfort as the presence of braces on the inside encroaches on your tongue space.



Getting started on your Invisalign journey in Singapore

Initial Consultation

Once you and your dentist have decided on proceeding with Invisalign treatment, the process begins with you taking:

- X-rays of your teeth and jaws
- Photos of your facial profile and smile
- An impression mould or digital scan of your teeth

All this information will then be submitted to the Invisalign technical team for processing and creating a Clincheck treatment plan customised for you.

Clincheck Approval

After your dentist has reviewed and amended the initial proposed Clincheck treatment plan, you'll be scheduled for a follow up consultation to discuss the proposed Clincheck treatment plan.

Patients are highly recommended to discuss their Clincheck treatment plans with their dentist before approving. Changes can be made to the treatment plan at this point.

During this visit, patients will be able to share any concerns or questions that they may have before the aligners are fabricated.

Aligner Fabrication

After the confirmation of the Clincheck treatment plan by the patient, the Invisalign clear aligners will be manufactured at the Align Technology production facility in Mexico.

After these aligners have been fabricated, they'll then be shipped over to our clinics in Singapore. This entire process usually takes about 2 weeks from the confirmation of your Clincheck treatment plan.

Aligner Fitting & Attachments

On your next visit, your dentist will place dental attachments on your teeth in accordance to the treatment plans. Attachments are small, tooth coloured studs which are glued onto your teeth to guide the direction of force. After which, we'll issue a series of aligners with guidelines on how to properly wear, care and remove them. You will be given 2-3 sets of Invisalign aligners to wear till the next review about 6 weeks later. You will sequentially move up each pair of aligners till the next review with your dentist.

Each pair of aligners is usually worn for about 2 weeks before progressing to the next pair. Some clinics get their Invisalign patients started on Dental Monitoring, the A.I. tracking system that allows for an enhanced Invisalign Treatment journey. This allows your dentist to track your Invisalign treatment in great detail through weekly photographs and an A.I. detection system that will alert your dentist in the event if any issues arise.

Duration of Treatment

You have to use the aligners night and day, and only remove them to brush, floss or eat.

Teeth will start moving gradually over time, and your dentist will monitor the progress as often as possible through the use of Dental Monitoring.

The entire journey, can take a year or up to 2 years for complex cases. At the end of treatment, you will require retainers to maintain your teeth in the corrected position.

What retainer options do you have after Invisalign?

You have two main options for retainers after your Invisalign treatment.

Patients will need to wear retainers to maintain the results of their Invisalign Treatment.

Removable retainers – Examples include clear retainers, or the more traditional retainers with a wire across the outer surfaces of your teeth (Hawley retainers). Invisalign also has its own Vivera retainers, which can be ordered once treatment is completed. Retainers need to be worn for at least six months full time (day and night). They should only be removed when eating, brushing, and during active sports, similar to Invisalign. After 6 months the retainers can be worn at night-time only.

Fixed retainers – Fixed retainers consist of a thin wire that is bonded onto the inner surface of your front 6 teeth. It is suitable for the less compliant, cases which are more likely to relapse and those who are tired of having to remove their aligners or retainers whenever they eat.

Is there any age restriction for Invisalign?

No! Invisalign treatment can be a great solution for both adults and teens looking for a low-profile method to improve your smile. The innovations and technological advancements from Invisalign make it possible to fix nearly all common teeth-straightening and bite issues, from simple to complex — all without interrupting your busy life.

And, thanks to a discreet blue dot on the outside of teen aligners, parents can be sure their child is wearing their clear aligners for sufficient amount of time.

Are tooth extractions required for Invisalign?

Generally, dentists avoid extraction whenever possible. However, the need of an extraction is highly dependant on the complexity of the alignment and how crowded the teeth are.

Patients are highly advised to book an appointment with a dentist/orthodontist so that they can better understand their potential treatment options.

How do I take care of my Invisalign clear aligners?

Patients need to wear their aligners at least 20-22 hours daily. Aligners should only be removed for eating, drinking, brushing and flossing. When wearing the aligners, it is advised only to drink plain water.

Patients are required to brush their aligners gently using their toothbrush followed by rinsing with cool water, after they remove the aligners to ensure that their aligners stay clean and hygienic.

Do not soak Invisalign aligners in hot water as this will cause the clear plastic to deform. Patients are to always carry the Invisalign issued aligner container with them. Keep aligners in their containers when not in use to prevent losing, breaking them and from deforming.

Here are some tips for successful Invisalign Treatment

Discipline and consistency. As you need to wear the aligners for 20 - 22 hours every day, you need to be diligent with the aligner wear to achieve best results. You have to remove the Invisalign aligner before any meal and you must clean your teeth very well before using the aligners again.

Maintain good oral hygiene and floss regularly. You need to pay strict attention to maintaining good oral hygiene. You must thoroughly brush and floss after you eat anything. This is to prevent any dental decay or gum problems during the Invisalign treatment. You also have to go for regular dental checks and cleaning every six months. Even though some patients might feel that this is annoying, others experience unexpected result of enhanced teeth whitening and oral health.

How often will I have an appointment with my dentist?

Appointments will be scheduled for you every 8-12 weeks, depending on your progress and condition. Some clinics offer dental monitoring in their clinics which you can opt for to allow your dentists to monitor your treatment in real-time, reducing the required number of appointments throughout your treatment.

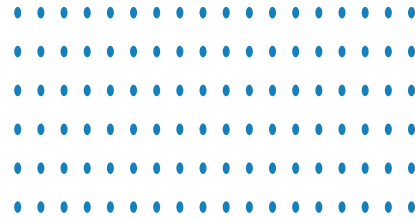
